School district residents are no doubt intrigued with the sudden publicized influx of Federal funds to school districts. Annual school budgets come first, and once guidance arrives from SED planning for the use of new Federal funds begins for what "maybe" up to a four year period. Care should be taken not to buttress annual school district budgets with these funds and stakeholders must be aware of not only the opportunity these funds may provide but also the future financial cliff that will follow. Expectations and aspirations must be matched with the reality that the Federal funds that currently support the state budget will wane as will the federal fund available to school districts. Long range financial analysis and planning must be the order of the day.

**Dr. Sean-Eversley-Bradwel** joined the ICSD Board in 2009. Prior to that Sean had been a Social Studies teacher at Ithaca's Lehman Alternative School. He went on to earn a PhD in Public Policy from Cornell, with a focus on educational policy.

Mark Mattison – President of the Altmar-Parish-Williamstown Central School District. Mark is a dedicated member and leader of the APW Board. He is constantly seen at academic award presentations, sporting events, musicals & plays.

**Peg Peri** – Peg has served on the Cincinnatus Central School Board of Education since July 1, 2005. During this time, she has served several terms as President as well as Vice President. Peg was instrumental in initiating the district's Strategic Plan. She has also been a mentor to new Board members.

**Douglas Ann Land** – Prior to completing her active Board of Education service in 2018, Douglas served on the Board of Education for Trumansburg Central School as a member for 27-years. During that time period she was instrumental in hiring five superintendents of schools

for Trumansburg, the completion of numerous capital projects totaling over \$40 million, and helping to bring the current Universal Pre-Kindergarten program to fruition.

**Geralyn Huba** – As an active, faithful member of the Skaneateles Board of Education from 2013 to 2020, Geralyn Huba was instrumental in helping the Skaneateles school district meet far-reaching challenges arising from the Great Recession.

V. Ann Wright – When V. Ann Wright passed away on Sunday, Oct. 11, 2020, she left a lifetime of volunteering and service to others that will benefit the Central New York educational community for years to come. Most of her work focused on the Onondaga-Cortland-Madison BOCES Board of Education, where she served 34-years, including nearly 27-years as Board of Education president, until just before the time of her death. Throughout that time, she was a passionate and tireless advocate for OCM BOCES and a true believer in the valuable services it provides for thousands of students and educators in the region.

**Deborah Kolod** – Debbie Kolod is a lifelong resident of the East Syracuse Minoa District, residing in East Syracuse. She and her husband, Chris, have three children who are ESM graduates. Mrs. Kolod works for Jamesville-DeWitt School District as a Typist II. She has an Associate's Degree from Empire State College and is also an ESM graduate. She is serving her third term on the ESM Board of Education and is currently the Board of Education President.

**Kathryn Carlson** – Cayuga Onondaga School Board Association nominee Kathryn Carlson has served as a member of the Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES Board of Education for the last 13 years. During her tenure, Kathryn has been elected to represent and serve the Board as both their Vice President (4-years) and President (3-years). In addition, Ms. Carlson has served on the BOCES' Audit Committee; and currently utilizes her wisdom, expertise and insight on the BOCES' Policy Committee.

# **Feature Chancellor Young**

CNYSBA's 2020-21 Annual Dinner will be held on May 26th and will feature a very special keynote speaker, Dr. Lester W. Young, Jr., the Chancellor of the New York State Board of Regents.

Dr. Young has made creating opportunities "where every student can be successful" the guiding principle of his more than 50 years of public service. He began his career with the New York City Department of Education, holding positions as: Teacher, Guidance Counselor, Supervisor of Special Education and Principal. During his tenure as Principal, PS 183 Brooklyn (Ocean-Hill Brownsville), was recognized as a School of Excellence by the United States Department of Education (USDOE) and the New York State Education Department (NYSED) in 1987.

Dr. Young also served as Assistant and Associate Commissioner with the NYSED (1988-1993) and led the department's efforts in NYC.

In 1993, returning to his Brooklyn roots, Dr. Young was appointed to the position of Community Superintendent, CSD 13. As Superintendent, Dr. Young is credited for establishing two successful and highly sought-after schools (Benjamin Banneker Academy HS and Bedford Academy HS) as well as replicating the nationally recognized Algebra Project and Comer School Development Program. In 2000, Chancellor Harold Levy appointed Dr. Young to serve as Senior Superintendent (coordinating services in four Central Brooklyn Community School Districts). He also established and led the first N.Y.C. Office of Youth Development and School Community Services. In 2004, after 35 years of NYC public school service, Lester W. Young, Jr. retired from the NYCDOE. During the period 2004 – 2008 Dr. Young held the position of Visiting Professor at Long Island University, Graduate School of Education, Brooklyn Campus.

In March 2008 Lester W. Young, Jr. was appointed by the New York State Legislature as Regent At Large, The University of the State of New York and in April 2020 was appointed by the NYS Legislature to a fourth term as Regent At Large. At the January 2021 Board of Regents meeting, Dr. Young was unanimously elected by his peers to be Chancellor effective January 12, 2021.


Dr. Young volunteers as a mentor to superintendents, principals and aspiring leaders throughout New York City. He has been recognized by many local, national education, and civic education organizations for his professional contributions.

Dr. Young is profiled in Men of Courage II, documenting the lives and achievements of 27 African American Men. He is also a contributing writer to Child by Child: The Comer Process for Change in Education, 1999. Dr. Young is married to Dr. Renee Young and they are the proud parents of one son. Dr. Young received his Doctoral Degree in Education (Ed.D.) from Fordham University, specializing in Urban Education and Human Development; and the Master of Science Degree (M.S.) from Brooklyn College.
